When the app store loses its luster, turn to these four i-accessories to take your tech to the next level. —MARINA LAMANNA



Compatibility. Tablets that support "USB OTG" or "USB Host" mode will work (desktops, laptops, iPads). Set your device on the carriage, plug in the USB, and it acts as virtual paper.

Modern updates. You can still type on paper with your tablet connected via USB, allowing you to electronically save your work while typing old-school.

Contemporary keyboard. Includes advanced-function keys such as Ctrl, Alt, Esc and arrows.

Conversion kits. Already got a typewriter? Bring it up to speed with Zylkin's DIY kits, starting at \$54. Choose between preassembled and ready to install (read: tech rookie) or solder-it-yourself (read: computer savant).

Reclaimed materials. Zylkin modifies vintage typewriters to work as keyboards for USB-capable devices. Bonus: The tactile click of the keys and the bell at line's end add a nostalgic touch.
